

# Dig a Well with Water to Thrive

## Water Facts – Christmas Eve 2009

### Did you know?

- 2 billion people around the world do not have access to clean water.
- The water crisis claims more lives through disease than any war claims through guns.
- In these water-needy communities, the average person uses as little as one gallon of water per day. This includes drinking, cooking and cleaning.
- The daily water requirement for basic healthy living is 13 gallons.
- The average American uses 75-150 gallons of water per day.
- An American taking a five-minute shower uses more water than the typical person in these countries uses in a whole day.
- Lack of access to clean water means basic sanitation does not happen. Most people in developing country have never bathed, except in dirty lakes and streams.
- 1.4 million children die every year as a result of diarrhea.
- It's estimated clean water and proper handwashing would decrease child diarrhea-related deaths by two-thirds.
- Women and children spends hours each day collecting water from distant, often polluted sources.



### *How Can I Get Involved?*

- During this year, FLY is sponsoring a fundraising drive, challenging this congregation to give \$3500 to dig a water well for a village in rural Ethiopia.
