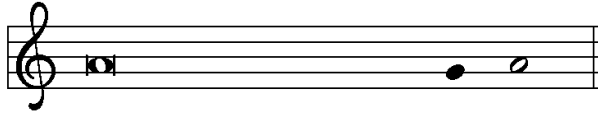

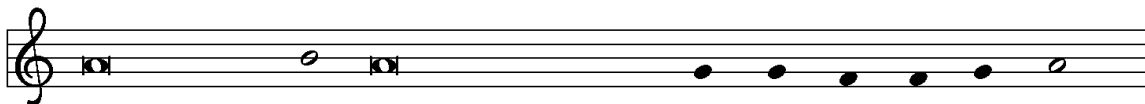

HAITI EARTHQUAKE RELIEF ELCA DISASTER RESPONSE

On Tuesday, January 12, a magnitude 7.0 earthquake rocked the island country of Haiti, primarily impacting the capital, Port-au-Prince. Offices, hotels, houses and shops have collapsed.
