

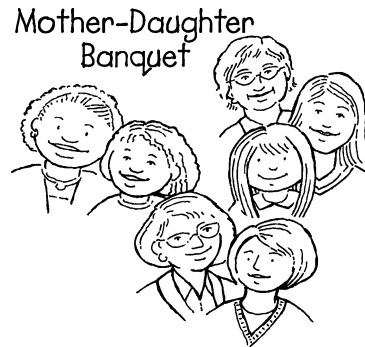
WORSHIP ATTENDANCE last Sunday morning was 211.
